emergency school relief, with 90% going to
school districts. Despite this, SC budget Proviso
1.108 is not authorizing money for masking
mandates in schools or on buses.


VOTER UPDATES

The state website, <u>SCVotes.gov</u> has updated voting information. Look under "Check My Voter Registration" to be sure it's up to date.

Generally, voters must register 30 days before the election to be eligible to vote. With recent purges of the rolls, EVERYONE should check your status before October 4, 2021.

Absentee ballots are now available, but Covid-19 **will not** be a valid reason for voting absentee in SC this year.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Open Carry passed--Since August 15, South Carolina law allows a person to carry a loaded handgun openly in public including places like playgrounds, as well as bars and other places that serve alcohol.

Moms Demand Action believes the gun lobby will make passing permitless carry their main priority next year. "We need all the support we can get to be prepared to take on the gun lobby and fight for gun safety in South Carolina and across the country."

Racial Turnout Gap Grew in Jurisdictions Previously Covered by the Voting Rights Act

Between 2012 and 2020, the white-Black turnout gap grew between 9.2 and 20.9 percentage points across five of the six states originally covered by Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act.
