Democrats account for about 46% of eligible voters in SC, but Republicans hold 2/3 of the State House seats--a super-majority in both houses. We need to break their grip on power, or continue to get bad bills like anti-DEI, school vouchers and the punitive, no-exceptions abortion ban, <u>S. 323</u>.

With the resignation of Rep. Chris Murphy, the District 98 State House seat is available and flippable. Let's learn from past errors of low participation and show up for the Nov. 4 Democratic Primary (early voting is from Oct. 20 through Oct. 31, 8:30 AM to 5 PM).




