A LOOK AHEAD AT THE 2024 LEGISLATIVE SESSION IN COLUMBIA

Four members of your Dorchester County Democratic Party (Linda Buchanan, Aniya Cohen, Steve Nida, and David Rubin) examined 250 pieces of legislation that were pre-filed by the middle of December, 2023. These bills provide clues to what the Republican-dominated Legislature has in store for the rest of us in 2024.

Below are some topics of greatest interest. We will be exploring these issues and others in depth in the next few months with postings to the DCDP website.

Control of School Libraries and Librarians. Superintendent of Education Ellen Weaver has made it a priority to create a state-approved list of books suitable for the education of South Carolina students, thereby sidelining school librarians and their expertise. She is working with Republican allies in the Legislature. Their bills target so-called "obscene' content, books dealing with gender issues, and sexual education.

Transgender Culture Wars. These bills provide a legislative "solution" to the Republican fear of encountering a transgendered person in a locker room, dorm room, or dressing room. Others will limit what physicians can do to offer gender transition procedures to minors.

Selecting Judges. Republicans have not yet filed bills to fix the corrupt manner in which the Legislature chooses judges. However, one good reform bill has been filed by Independent Senator Mia McLeod. The real action will come if and when Republicans start making specific proposals.

Not all is bleak. Some bills will increase teacher salaries, with one focusing on salaries for special education teachers.

On abortion, one bill would provide young people with easier access to birth control medications obtained directly from pharmacists. Two Assembly Democrats have introduced an amendment to the state constitution to protect a woman's right to reproductive freedom. If passed, this would put abortion on the ballot in South Carolina, something Republicans greatly fear.

Finally, a number of bills take note of the crisis in affordable housing and propose modest solutions.

The session starts January 9 and extends to May 9. Stay tuned.
